Speaker

Tom Scott, Executive Director, CyberSC

Thomas Scott is the Chief Information Security Officer for Synergi Partners, the largest privately owned tax credit, incentive consulting and processing company in the United States. As the first director of the SC Cyber Consortium, he has been a key leader in efforts to promote cyber education, cyber workforce development and cyber protection in South Carolina and across the nation. Scott is the founding director of the nonprofit South Carolina Cyber Foundation and Association.

With over 30 years of state government experience in Florida and South Carolina, Scott has developed a wealth of knowledge and experience in protecting state critical infrastructure and cyber assets. He holds certifications in information security, information auditing, security leadership, critical infrastructure protection and project management. He is also recognized a Federal Emergency Management Agency Continuity of Operations Planning practitioner.

Scott is a member of the FBI's InfraGard program and serves as an advisory board member for the Dutch Fork High School Cyber program. He has actively participated as a member of the Multi State Information Sharing and Analysis Center's executive committee as well as the University of South Carolina School of Law Cybersecurity Task Force. Scott serves the academic community through service on the industry advisory boards for the University of South Carolina, ECPI-Charleston, Aiken Technical College, Florence-Darlington Technical College and Charleston Southern University.

He received a bachelor's degree from the University of Georgia and master's degree from Florida State University.
