Predicting the Short-term Future: How Live Modeling Can Save Lives in a Storm Event

Brian Bates, Vice President, Woolpert, Inc.

When a big storm is gathering on the horizon, local meteorologists can help people prepare with detailed weather forecasts predicting the amount of rain to expect, but rarely can they predict flood elevations, times of flood peaks, and the overall impact to homes, businesses and infrastructure. Details such as those require extensive inventory data and robust hydrologic and hydraulic models. Traditional large and detailed computer models can take eight to 10 hours to run — what if you need to predict what is going to happen in just four hours?

With resources made available from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration combined with today's computing power, machine learning, remote sensing and GIS technology, we now have the ability to predict what is going to happen as conditions change in real-time during a volatile storm.

This session will highlight some of the live modeling methods including both traditional hydrologic and hydraulic models as well as machine learning options, and also present an example of a dashboard for effectively utilizing this information.
