## **Overview** \*

- $\checkmark$ Food Trucks are estimated to have started in the 1860's
- $\checkmark$ Food Trucks started out going to construction sites, factories and blue-collar locations
- 1 The Food Truck industry is a 2 Billion-Dollar industry
- The industry's overall revenue has grown 300% in the  $\checkmark$ last 3 years
- Food Trucks are also known as "roach coaches" or 1 "gut trucks"
- Starting costs for creating a Food Truck averages between 1 \$50,000 to \$60,000 thousand dollars
- Food Trucks can be a truck, trailer, cart, wagon, etc.  $\checkmark$

### FOOD TRUCK REQUIREMENTS



#### STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA REQUIREMENTS:

- SOUTH CAROLINA DHEC PERMIT (REGULATION 61-25)
- APPROVED COMMISARY
- SOUTH CAROLINA RETAIL LICENSE
- ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSING (IF APPLICABLE)

#### **CITY OF GREER REQUIREMENTS:**

- SLED OR NATIONAL BACKGROUND CHECK
- LIABILITY INSURANCE
- DRIVER'S LICENSE
- NATIONAL SEX OFFENDER SEARCH
- REMIT HOSPITALITY TAXES
- FIRE MARSHAL INSPECTION (to be cont.)VEHICLE REGISTRATION

A Business License will be issued after all necessary documents are collected and the Fire Marshal inspection is passed.


### Fire Marshal Inspection

The Fire Marshal inspection will identify and eliminate basic fire hazards, while educating vendors of the potential hazards. The Fire Marshal inspects the following:

- Ensure that the Food Truck does not impede traffic, and that emergency vehicles can access the Food Truck/public if necessary.
- Inspect Hood and/or Fire Suppression System, verify the inspection has been inspected by a 3rd party and the inspection is not expired.
- Verify that the correct Fire Extinguisher is located on the Food Truck, usually a 2A10BC.
- Inspect all compressed gas cylinders.
- Inspect Carbon Monoxide and Compressed Gas Detectors
- Inspect grease traps to ensure that liquid waste is disposed of properly

Notes:

Food Truck 1 has not completed their inspection, therefore no permit or Business License has been issued.

Food Truck 2 is exempt from DHEC Permit under Permit Exemptions Regulation 61-25 Food Truck 2 passed inspection, therefore was issued a permit and Business License.

#### **INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL**


- Festival began in 2014.
- Festival started without any food trucks, just traditional food vendors.
- Fast forward to 2023, we now feature 14 food trucks and 6 traditional food vendors.

#### **FOOD TRUCK ROLLOUT**

- The program launched in 2016 with just 3 food trucks.
- The program expanded from 1 event during the Spring and Fall seasons to 6 food truck rollouts annually.
- Each food truck rollout hosts between 7-8 trucks.

#### **FREEDOM BLAST**

- Established in 2009
- The Cities largest event, attracting more than 20,000 attendees.
- Featuring 17 food trucks in 2023 and expected to grow.
